Without trust, there is no relationship.


We begin our journey to become a *Dynamic Disciple* when we are baptized. Whether as an infant or a teen or as an adult, the journey always begins with our baptism where we receive the *Gifts of the Holy Spirit*¹ and God's *sanctifying grace*². We begin as a SEEKER.

SEEKERS are people who always want to know more to the point where their minds become restless. If you are a SEEKER, you are not simply curious you are defined by your curiosity. According to Cathy Duffy, seeking isn't just about observing and gaining knowledge, it's about exploring the world.

There are different ways we TRUST at different times in our lives. Infants and young children have complete TRUST in the adults around them. It is TRUST in its purest form! Perhaps that is why Jesus told us that we should become like little children in order to enter into the Kingdom of Heaven (Matthew 18:3-4)

***"TRUST in the Lord with all your heart, on your own intelligence rely not;
In all your ways be mindful of Him, and He will make straight your paths." (Proverbs 3:5-6)***

TRUST Timeline



From the very beginning of creation, God has instructed us to TRUST Him...don't eat that one tree (TRUST me, I know what is best for you.), "I make you a promise, Noah." (TRUST me, I won't do this again.); Abraham, TRUST me."; "Moses, tell them I will give them many blessings if they follow my rules." (TRUST me, I want only for your happiness.) "Mary, TRUST me.;" "Elizabeth, TRUST me.," Isaiah, TRUST me." And so on throughout the Old and New Testament and even today, the importance of TRUST cannot be stressed enough. TRUST is the foundation for all relationships. Without TRUST, there is no relationship.

Baptism to Age 4 (Begins with the family - the *Domestic Church*)

TRUST at Baptism and during infancy and toddler age is only a matter of simple words and actions. A child's natural instinct is TRUST and the words and actions of the adults in his/her life model the earliest words and actions of a *Dynamic Disciple*. Some examples include:

Catechesis

- Sign of the Cross/Holy Water (See pg)
- Praying hands (See page)
- Nighttime prayer (kneeling if possible, Guardian Angel prayer, simple blessing)
- Mealtime blessings

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Age 5 - Ages 10: Elementary School Grades K – 5th

Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation (First Holy Communion, Confession)

The family, the *Domestic Church*³, continues to be the first place where children learn to TRUST and witness discipleship in action first hand but they are now exposed to other people, children, cultures, beliefs, media and emotions that may challenge that TRUST. If a child does not have a well-grounded theological foundation, they may easily slip away from the influence, values and beliefs of their family and lean toward trusting others more than their family. One hour a week for 30 Sundays of religious education at the church is mainly meant to catechize, to teach the Christian Catholic way. The real foundation is in the home and the world outside the classroom walls.

Catechesis

Pre-Kindergarten: *Sign of Cross, praying hand positions, kneeling, looking for God's creations, genuflecting, and quiet time with Jesus:* **GOALS:** Helps children develop an understanding and awareness of **God's creation and His continual love of them.**

Kindergarten – Our Father, Hail Mary, Prayer to Guardian Angel. **GOALS:** Help children develop a **relationship with God through knowledge and experience.**

First Grade - Glory Be, Morning Offering, Diocesan Prayer for Vocations, and review of previously learned prayers. **GOALS:** Help children to **know and appreciate that God is their loving Father and the Creator of all things.**

Second Grade – *Act of Contrition, Eucharistic Responses at Mass, Ten Commandments*, and review of previously learned prayers and responses. **GOALS:** To further the understanding that the Church is a community of God’s people. We become a member of the Church family through the sacrament of Baptism, are reconciled through the sacrament of Reconciliation, and are strengthened through the sacrament of Eucharist.

Third Grade - *Apostles’ Creed, Acts of Faith, Hope and Love, Mysteries of the Rosary, four types of prayer* (praise, thanksgiving, contrition, and petitions), and review previously of learned prayers and responses. **GOALS:** To help students understand the revelation of God: through Jesus Christ, Sacred Scripture, and through **Church Traditions**.

Fourth Grade - *Two Great commandments, Beatitudes, Holy Days of Obligation, Nicene Creed*, and review of previously learned prayers and responses. **GOALS:** To help students live more fully with their Christian faith through **participation in the life of the church** and the understanding of sacred scripture, as a means of growing closer to God.

Fifth Grade – *Angelus, Rosary, Hail Holy Queen, Memorare, Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy, the Seven Sacraments*, and review of previously learned prayers and responses. **GOALS:** To help students become more responsible members of the church and their family through the study of the Sacraments.

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Ages 11 – 13: Middle School: Grades 6 – 8

(Sacrament of Confirmation)

Sixth Grade – *Prayer to the Holy Spirit (Pg _____)* and review of previously learned prayers and responses **GOALS:** To enable the students to recognize and understand that their faith journey is a covenant process beginning with the Old Testament, fulfilled by Jesus in the New Testament, and lived out in stewardship, communal worship, and prayer.

Seventh Grade – *Prayer journaling (Pg. _____), Stations of the Cross (Pg _____)*, and review of previously learned prayers. **GOALS:** To enable the students to understand the life and ministry of Jesus as revealed in scripture and to help them appreciate the meaning and significance of the sacramental life of the Church.

Eighth Grade – *The Creed (Pg _____) and Liturgy of the Hours (Pg _____)* and review of previously learned prayers. **GOALS:** To enable the students to trace the historical development of the Church from the time of Jesus to the present and to understand the mission and ministry of the Church to which we are all called.

PRAYERS

Ages 14 – 18: Junior and Senior High School

According to many parents, this age group is the greatest challenge. It requires moving from holding their hands to teach and protect them to standing beside them to direct and support them...to help them maneuver the road of life. Our goal is to bring them from total independence at birth to total independence by age 18, for many age 16.

They are no longer children, they have less parental oversight, more independent freedom to make their own decisions, they begin to drive and attend social functions without parental oversight. For many, they tend to be more influenced by their peers and social media, then their parents and pastors. The *TRUST* factor is based more on emotion. Their values can be easily diluted or the need to belong is stronger than the will to resist. The lines between right and wrong become blurred. Spiritually, we may give them the right answers to questions, but it is that personal relationship with Jesus that will be their true sense of strength. As one pastor noted, “ We give our kids lots of stuff to learn but we do not teach them how it all fits into a pattern of happiness in their lives.”

For many protestants, “friendship evangelism” or “friendship dating” is the norm. Jeff Cavins speaks of this in one of his presentations and how when arriving at his protestant girlfriend’s home to pick her up, her dad routinely grilled him about his Catholic faith: “Why do you worship Mary?”, “Why do you call the priest *Father*?”, “Did you know that at one time there were 3 popes?”, “Why do you sacrifice Jesus over and over again on the altar?”. Fortunately for Jeff, his family had laid a solid faith foundation and had numerous in-house resources to be able to explain and biblically support our Catholic beliefs.

TRUST

As our children enter into Junior and Senior high school, they will be challenged about many of their beliefs and values including their faith and if they are unable to defend their beliefs, they will begin to drift even during their studies for Confirmation.

Matthew Kelly does a really good job of explaining this in his CD *The Best Way to Live*. He challenges young people who are beginning their Confirmation journey to choose between seeking to live the *pleasure principle* or the *happiness principle*.⁵

It is not enough that we know the answers to challenging questions but that we have also formed a **personal relationship** with Jesus. A good place to begin is to read together Exodus 33 and discuss with our young people what that means to them, how it affects their every action. What would their lives look like if Jesus was their **intimate friend**? What does Trust in Jesus look like for you every waking moment? How does that affect your goal of becoming the *best-version-of-yourself*?

TRUST is the foundation for every human relationship in our lives. It is not enough for parents and grandparents and friends to *talk the talk*, we must *walk-the-walk* too. They will listen and more importantly they will watch what you do.

1. Give Your **Kids** a Good Role Model. The relationships that you demonstrate to your **kids** should be ones that put **trust** on the forefront. ...
2. Openly Talk about **Trust**. ...
3. Communicate and Be Honest to Instill **Trust**. ...
4. Encourage Friendships That Involve **Trust**.

Ages 19 - 21

At this point in life, the young adult may go many directions and have new challenges and distractions. College, marriage, a job – many may be completely own their own for the first time in their lives. This can be scary but also exciting since Mom and Dad will no longer be able to tell them what to do, where to go, who they should have as friends, or even to go to church or not. For these young people, they may never have developed a prayer life or a personal relationship with Jesus. “It is no surprise they would choose relationships that seem more real and immediate than a *church obligation*.” Cathy Duffy *Everyday Evangelism for Catholics*

For some they may no longer TRUST the Church or the people in it. There may be deep hurts, or they may have chosen personal life choices they know would never be accepted by the Church. Our intention with this group is NOT to condemn or judge but to focus on the destination of their eternal souls. This can be tricky to do without preaching or pushing. The Church will never waiver on standing up for the truth, but she is also a beacon of Christ’s mercy. As a friend of mine in the LGBT group shared with me, “I know that I am jeopardizing my eternity of happiness with Jesus for my brief happiness on this earth. It is something I grapple with every day of my life.” The important thing for them to know is, “*While the Church does not waiver on standing up for truth, she is also a beacon of Jesus’ mercy.*” Cathy Duffy *Everyday Evangelism for Catholics*

Ages 22 – 35

Much may be happening with this age group: growing family, career, and financial challenges may not leave a much time to deepen their spiritual life. For many Catholics, this journey ended with Confirmation. Unlike our protestant brethren, Catholics rely on fulfilling their MASS obligation and listening to the Sunday readings and homilies to meet knowledge needs. According to research company **CARA**⁶, _____% of this age group only attend Mass once a month and special holy days such as

Christmas and Easter. Many do not marry in the Church and may only return to have their children receive the Sacraments of Baptism or 1st Holy Communion. While we have *catechized* (**TAUGHT** them the faith) we have failed to give them the *intimate relationship* that is required to fully understand and be able to explain the Real Presence in the Eucharist and how to take it into the outside world we live.

For some protestants who have heard the Gospel and claim a personal relationship with Jesus, they can easily move from one protestant denomination to another. However, converting to Catholicism is more of a theological challenge. Issues such as the Catholic belief in the Real Presence in the Eucharist, confession to a priest, the Rosary and devotion to Mary, abuse scandal and hierarchy of the pope. *“We don’t build TRUST by arguing theological points. The more Bible **literate** a Catholic is, the better to be able to converse with a Protestant.”* Cathy Duffy *Everyday Evangelism for Catholics*


